#### Honey Bee


Honey bee wings beat over 200 beats per second! They can fly as fast as 15 miles per hour.

Honey bees collect pollen and nectar from flowers by using their long tongues to suck out the nectar. They store the nectar in their stomachs until they get back to the hive. Worker bees suck the nectar from their stomachs and spread the nectar throughout the honeycombs where it becomes thick syrup, honey.


To communicate, honey bees do a waggle dance to explain where more nectar is located. Honey bees pollinate plants while collecting nectar from flowers. They are responsible for pollinating 80% of the fruits and vegetables we eat, so they are very important!









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
